



## ASEAN PASS FAQ

### WHO IS THE ASEAN PASS OPEN TO?

The ASEAN PASS is open to nationals of the following countries: from **Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Brunei, Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar** and **Vietnam**. A valid passport of this country will be required to be eligible for this Pass.

### WHAT DOES THE ASEAN PASS GET ME?

You can opt for either a 4-Day ASEAN PASS (29 October – 1 November) or else a 1-Day ASEAN Pass (29 Oct, 30 Oct, 31 Oct, 1 Nov). On this Pass you have access to all Main Program events.

### HOW MUCH DOES THE ASEAN PASS COST?

The ASEAN PASS is a 20% discount off full price International 4-Day and 1-Day Passes. The costing breakdown is below:

**I LIVE IN AN ASEAN COUNTRY, BUT DO NOT HAVE A PASSPORT OF THAT COUNTRY. CAN I STILL BUY AN ASEAN PASS?**

Unfortunately no. We require evidence of an ASEAN Passport (i.e. a Passport from Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Brunei, Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar and Vietnam) in order to be eligible for the ASEAN Pass.

You would need to purchase an International 4-day or 1-Day Pass.

**CAN I USE MY ASEAN PASS TO GAIN ACCESS TO SPECIAL EVENTS OR WORKSHOPS?**

No, you will need to purchase desired Special Events or Workshops separately.

**WHY ARE YOU OFFERING AN ASEAN PASS?**

We are offering the ASEAN Pass in recognition of the special place the UWRF holds within Southeast Asia, and its mission to showcase not just Indonesian arts and literature, but that of the broader ASEAN region.
